## **New Hampshire Boat Museum Announces Change in Leadership**

**Wolfeboro, NH:** The Board of Trustees of the New Hampshire Boat Museum announce that Lisa Simpson Lutts, the Museum's Executive Director, will step down from her position as of November 10<sup>th</sup>. At that time, Ms. Simpson Lutts and her family will be relocating to Castine, Maine to become Executive Director of the Castine Historical Society.

Ms. Simpson Lutts joined the Boat Museum staff in May, 2012. During her tenure she helped the Museum grow and professionalize. Among her accomplishments are the creation of the Museum's first Collections Management Policy, the design and implementation of new education programs including Lake Discovery Camp, and most recently overseeing the re-design of the Museum's website, [nhbm.org](http://nhbm.org).

Joe DeChiaro, President of the Museum's board says, "While we are saddened to see Lisa go, we all wish her the very best with her new endeavor. While this is a significant change for the New Hampshire Boat Museum, it also represents an opportunity as we move forward to find her replacement. The Board has formed a search committee to find a qualified and talented new Executive Director."

He goes on to say that "Lisa will continue to remain available to us for consultation and advice during this transition. In addition, Robin Sherman, our Operations Manager, will continue to work full-time at our winter off-site office in Clark Plaza managing the day-to-day operations."

The New Hampshire Boat Museum will close for the 2017 season on October 9 and re-open Memorial Day weekend, 2018. The Museum is a not-for-profit institution focusing on New Hampshire's boating and fresh water heritage. It is located at 399 Center Street, Wolfeboro Falls, 2 miles from downtown Wolfeboro in the former Allen "A" Resort dance hall.
