



Summer Museum Curatorial / Collections Intern Needed

The New Hampshire Boat Museum seeks a Curatorial / Collections Intern to work at its museum in Wolfeboro, New Hampshire during the 2019 summer. The internship will provide a solid introduction to museum work.

The Intern will work closely with museum staff on a collections care project. Among the duties to be performed are the continuation of collections inventory, photography of collection, and the rehousing of the museum's archives in acid-free folders and boxes for proper storage. The project will allow the Intern to learn collections care practices in a museum setting. If time allows, Intern will conduct an oral history project with members of the vintage boating community. Supervision and training will be provided by the museum's staff.

The Intern will set his/her own schedule working approximately 20 hours per week for six weeks. Work must primarily be conducted during the week. Additional paid hours will be available to work the Admissions Desk if interested.

Candidates should be in the process of completing their Bachelor's or Master's degree in history, museum studies or a related subject. Knowledge of PastPerfect database is a plus.
